

TOWN OF LOGANSPORT
MINUTES
March 8, 2011

The regular meeting of the Logansport Town Council was held Tuesday, March 8, 2011 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chamber with Mayor Katherine Freeman presiding. Council members present: Norman Arbuckle, Douglas Guillotte, June Hooper, and Edith Williams. Absent: Deborah Roberts.

Mrs. Williams opened the meeting with prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mayor Freeman.

With a motion from Mrs. Williams and second from Mr. Arbuckle the February minutes were approved. All ayes, one absent.

General fund bills were approved with a motion from Mrs. Williams and second from Mr. Arbuckle. All ayes, one absent.

Utility fund bills were approved with a motion from Mr. Arbuckle and second from Mrs. Williams. All ayes, one absent.

Planning & Zoning Chairman, Mary M. Thompson, presented the P&Z recommendations.

- 1) Complete the roof repairs and front façades on the 3rd Street property.
- 2) Place reflectors on the 2nd and 4th Street railroad barricades.
- 3) Remove old planks from the recently torn down boat pier on the riverfront.

Mrs. Thompson asked for a vote of support for the upcoming “Set Free 2011” event at the Riverstage on the riverfront to be held April 3rd thru 6th. This event is sponsored by the First Baptist Church in Logansport. There will be a different musical group each night and David Lang will be the speaker. The event was given support of the Council with a motion from Mr. Guillotte and second from Mr. Arbuckle. All ayes, one absent.

Linda Vidler informed the Council of the Logansport Little League’s desire for another baseball field and asked for suggestions as to how this wish could be met. It was suggested that the officers of the organization approach the Police Jury for assistance in building the field if the Town could come up with a place to build it.

The DeSoto Tourist Bureau is giving the Logansport Community Cemetery \$2,500 to help with needed repairs in the cemetery, as well as the Moses Rose grave in the Funston community. There will be a Parish wide “tour” of various old cemeteries on April 9th, 2011. In conjunction with this event, Glenn Price, local historian, will be at the Pavilion on this date for an oral history presentation.

With no further business to discuss the meeting adjourned with a motion from Mr. Arbuckle and second from Mrs. Hooper. All ayes, one absent.
